Honoring O'Keeffe's Creative Courage

For Audifax, Georgia O'Keeffe was an artist who created from a place of deep inner knowing. Rather than mimicking her style, Audifax sought to reflect the mindset O'Keeffe embraced.

"The conscious efforts put forth within a piece of art allow our soul to guide from a space of infinite knowledge," she explained. "I believe this was also the place that guided Georgia O'Keeffe by letting go and connecting to the bigger picture, her hands created something unique and expressive."

A Self-Taught Path Across the World

Audifax's journey into art began with a calling a literal voice from within telling her to paint. She started with a six-foot canvas and quickly discovered it wasn't big enough. That inner voice led her across the world, painting on the streets of Europe before street art was widely recognized in the United States.

"The first time I held a spray can and connected to a wall, I knew I was home," she says.

From sculpture and oil painting to large-scale murals, her style continues to evolve, rooted in intuition and a desire to create deeper connections.

Her style? Bold. Intuitive. Photo-realistic.

Painting With Community

The painting of "Opening" began with a pair of eyes, immediately sparking curiosity from passersby.

"People came into the parking lot to check out what was going on. We talked about the mural, the festival, and their own connections to art," Audifax shared.

From friendly waves and encouraging words to thoughtful conversations, the community in Sun Prairie made her feel welcomed and supported.

"One local business even brought us food after a long, hot day on the lift. That kind of gesture means everything," she added.

Advice for Artists

"Don't give up," Audifax says to young or emerging creatives. "Be your best ally. Develop your own style and live art in whatever way makes sense to you."

Creating a mural isn't always glamorous. On one day in particular, she spent over 12 hours on a lift in intense heat while wearing a ventilator mask. But for her, there was nowhere else she'd rather be.

What Would Georgia Think?

"I would respect a simple moment of stopping to look at it and silent appreciation," Audifax says. "The connection I feel to her work invites the thought that she would understand it without a lot of words."

The Real Easter Egg: Intention

While some murals contain hidden images or playful surprises, Audifax's secret is in the feeling.

"There is more of a gem within the feeling from the intention," she says. "If you don't stop to listen to yourself for the moment, to interpret the message from the piece, you'll miss the meaning."

In the Zone Without Music

Though she is also a DJ and loves music, Audifax chooses silence while painting.

"The process for me is all about focus and connecting with what I'm creating," she explained. "Even on a busy street, I find a way to tune out the world. I'm creating a gift a mirror to the inner love within yourself, a relationship waiting to blossom."

Final Reflection

Audifax's mural is a moment of stillness in a busy world. Her careful details and heartfelt message invite viewers to reconnect with their own inner truth. As part of Sun Prairie's Mural Fest, "Opening" is a reminder that creativity begins within.
